An iconic and highly collectible early production Petal Table designed by Richard Schultz for Knoll, originally introduced in 1960. This striking example features a cedarwood top composed of eight sculptural, petal-like slats radiating from a central stem, beautifully capturing the organic elegance of mid-century modern design. The table is supported by a white powder-coated cast aluminum base with eight radial legs, reflecting Schultz's masterful integration of form and function. This piece retains its original cedar top, a material used only in early versions before production shifted to teak and other finishes. A quintessential design from the golden era of Knoll, this table is both a functional piece and a sculptural statement, ideal for collectors and modern interiors alike. Made in the USA.
